**GUEST INSTRUCTOR: AHMET S. YAYLA, PHD, TNP (RETIRED)**

Dr. Yayla served a career in the Turkish National Police, culminating as Chief of the Counter-terrorism and Operations Division. His primary focus was terrorism and related activities of ISIS (IS, Islamic State), Al-Qaeda, Al-Nusra, Hezbollah, the PKK and other global terrorist organizations. As an expert in the field, Dr. Yayla transitioned to academia, researching terrorism, radicalization and countering violent extremism (CVE). Dr. Yayla was one of the first researchers to meet and interview ISIS defectors hiding in Turkey, leading to several articles and books on terrorism and violence. Dr. Yayla has testified before the U.S. Senate Homeland Security Committee and Subcommittee on Prevention of Nuclear and Biological Attacks, and served as an Official Advisor to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security on building connections with terrorism-targeted international communities living in the United States. Dr. Yayla serves as a tenured Professor and Chair of the Sociology Department at the University of Harran, in Sanliurfa, Turkey. He is presently on academic leave while co-directing the *ISIS Defectors Interview Project*. His latest book, "ISIS Defectors: Inside Stories of Confronting the Caliphate" will be released in April, 2016. Dr. Yayla earned both his Master's and Ph.D. from the University of North Texas.

**GUEST INSTRUCTOR: DANIEL GUERRERO, SPECIAL AGENT-FBI (RETIRED)**

Dan Guerrero's experience in the counterterrorism and security field spans more than three decades. After serving four years as an officer in the U.S. Marine Corps, he became a Special Agent with the FBI. Early in his FBI career, Mr. Guerrero worked in the field on violent crime, major offenders, foreign counterintelligence and major drug trafficking organizations, and served as a SWAT team member. Mr. Guerrero was then selected to serve as an Operator with the FBI's Hostage Rescue Team (HRT) where he eventually transitioned to a management role in the FBI's Crisis Management Unit (CMU). In 2001, Mr. Guerrero was appointed as the first FBI representative to the newly established Department of Homeland Security, where he served on the Interagency Incident Management Group, providing guidance to DHS leadership and the White House Security Council regarding domestic incident management. Mr. Guerrero has also represented the United States as a diplomat to Romania and Turkey. More recently, Mr. Guerrero worked as a supervisor in the Seattle FBI Field Office, where he served as the Crisis Management Coordinator as well as the Supervisory Resident Agent in Charge of the Everett and Bellingham Resident Offices. In 2014, he completed an assignment in Kabul, Afghanistan working with the Afghan government and the international community on rule of law and investigative matters. In September, 2014, after twenty-six years of service to the FBI, Mr. Guerrero retired and accepted a position as the Director for Security & Emergency Preparedness at Edmonds Community College. He is a partner with Salish Security & Consulting, an advisor to the Homeland Security & Emergency Management Board of Washington State, and a member of the Transportation Board of the City of Edmonds, Washington.



### Driving from The North:

Take I-15 South to Exit 295 (9000 South). Exit right (west) onto 9000 South and proceed to 450 West (1st light). Turn left (south), go to 9120 South & turn left (east), go to 300 West (frontage road) & turn right (south). Proceed 6 blocks south along frontage road.



### Driving from the South:

Take I-15 North to Exit 293 (10600 South) after exiting, turn left (west) and proceed to Jordan Gateway. Turn right (north), go to light at 10000 South (Sego Lily Dr) in Sandy. Turn right (East), go over the railroad tracks & turn left (north) on 300 West (frontage road). Proceed 2 blocks north along frontage road.
