Voluntary Relinquishment since last POST Council meeting 12**Allegations related to voluntary relinquishment:**

- DUI, leaving the scene of a property damage accident and obstruction of justice.
- Possession of a controlled substance, bringing controlled substance into a secure facility and distribution of controlled substance.
- Wanton destroy wildlife, obstruction of justice, and witness tampering.
- Enticing a minor.
- Sexual conduct on duty and lying under Garrity.
- Stalking.
- Lying under Garrity, dishonest in violation of policy, sexual battery sexual conduct on duty, and official misconduct.
- Sexual abuse of a minor.

- Possession of a controlled substance.
- Custodial sexual misconduct.
- Felony DUI, and possession of a firearm by an intoxicated person.
